

# A MUSIC NOTES

"Will You Come and Follow Me" (VU 567) was written by John L. Bell. A Church of Scotland minister, he is a member of the Iona Community, a broadcaster and a former student activist. He works throughout the world, often lecturing in theological colleges but is primarily concerned with the renewal of congregational worship at the grass roots level. Bell has produced many collections of original hymns and songs as well as two collections of songs of the World Church.

"Lord Speak to Me" (VU 589) was written by Frances Ridley Havergal in 1872. The daughter of an Anglican priest, she received a well-rounded education and was well travelled for a woman of that time. She wrote hundreds poems and hymns, many of which were set to music and published. "Lord, Speak to Me That I May Speak" has been set to two different tunes and has been published in 356 hymnals. The tune we are using was written by Samuel Wesley, an English organist and composer who was a contemporary of Mozart. He has sometimes been referred to as "the English Mozart".
