

One: In the name of the One who said, "I am the bread of life," I invite you to come and eat. In the name of the One who said, "I am the true vine," I invite you to come and drink. In the name of the One who said, "Love one another, as I have loved, you," I invite you to the table of Jesus Christ.

Call to Give Thanks:

- One: May God be with us.
- All: God is here among us.
- One: Let us open our hearts to God.
- All: We open them to God and to one another.
- One: Let us give thanks to God.
- All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Prayer of Great Thanksgiving:

One: Blessed are you, gracious God, Creator of light, Giver of all life, Source of love. From the dust of the earth, you created us in your image.
From the bondage and slavery, you delivered us. Through all our wilderness wanderings you guide us.

You call us to renewal and repentance,

to justice and compassion, to healing and wholeness. We thank you for sending us Jesus, your Chosen One, Bread for our journey. He lived and loved this human life. taking upon himself our suffering and sorrow, being tested as we are tested, and reaching out to broken victims of the world's brokenness. In him we come to know your truth, to feel the life that is Christ within us. So it is that throughout these Lenten days and nights we worship you, and bless your name: So it is that we join with those who have gone before us, with the angels of the heavens, and with all who will follow us in the holy community of faith, as we sing:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

One: On the night before he died, Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to those who sat with him, saying: "Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup, saying: "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood, shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me." Loving God, we rejoice in the gift of your grace, remembering Christ's life and death, proclaiming his resurrection, waiting in hope for his coming again.

Grant that in praise and thanksgiving, we may so offer ourselves to you that our lives may proclaim the mystery of faith:

#### All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Send your Holy Spirit, God, on us and what we do, One: that as we break bread and drink wine. we may be united with Christ, he in us and we in him, that we who are many may be one in him. Make us strong in faith and love, that we may become truly human, as Christ was truly human. Help us to love as Christ loved. Knowing our own weakness, may we stand with all who stumble. Sharing in his suffering, may we remember all who suffer. Held in his love. may we embrace all whom the world denies. Rejoicing in his forgiveness, may we forgive all who sin against us. Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, God most holy, now and forever. Let the people say, "Amen!"

# A MUSIC NOTES A

"Today's offertory is based on the hymn tune 'St. Peter', written by Alexander Robert Reinagle in 1836. The tune was named after St. Peter-in-the-East, a church in Oxford, England where Reinagle was organist from 1822-53. Of Austrian descent, he came from a family of musicians and became a well-known organ teacher. 'St. Peter' is most commonly associated with 2 different texts, 'How Sweet the Name of Jesus Sounds' (1774) by John Newton, a reformed slave trader who also wrote 'Amazing Grace', and 'In Christ There Is No East or West' (1908) by John Oxenham, a prolific English journalist, novelist and poet."

#### Grieving the Loss of a Companion Animal:


