MUSIC NOTES A

Humour is difficult to achieve in classical music when there is no text involved, but that hasn't stopped composers from inventing types of music or trying to put together witty elements in order to achieve humour. Dvorak wrote 8 'humoresques', a genre characterized by fanciful humour in the sense of mood rather than wit. 'Scherzo' means 'joke' in Italian and usually refers to a fast moving humorous instrumental composition. For centuries, musicians and musicologists have been trying to identify the humour in Mozart's "A Musical Joke", a 4 movement work written for string quartet and 2 French horns. There is speculation that it is satirical, its harmonic and rhythmic "gaffes" serving to parody the work of incompetent composers. However, an ornithologist has suggested that the music mimics a starling because of the intertwined tunes and the awkwardness and off key whistle-like passages in the horns. It is known that Mozart had a pet starling at one point. A more accurate translation of the title of this work (Ein musikalischer Spass) would be "Some Musical Fun". Mozart didn't leave any clues as to what kind of musical fun he was really making.
