## A MUSIC NOTES A

Jan Garrett, composer of 'I Dreamed of Rain', is a jazz singer and a multi award winning songwriter. In her own words about this song she says, "I grew up in Colorado and take the natural world as my birthright. It had been a particularly hot dry year in 2002 and wild fires were raging across much of the western US. The political scene felt equally troubling and out of control (just prior to US invasion of Irag). It was as if the whole world was on fire. In the midst of all this unrest, I began to have dreams of rain; the kind of luscious healing rain that comes to renew the natural world and the human soul after a long drought. The words and music for this song are a direct translation of that exhilarating feeling. We no longer have to repeat the mistakes of our ancestors. We are free to forgive, release the pain, and start over again with a clean slate."
