

Invitation to the Table

One: The Lord be with you.

One: It is indeed right that we should praise you, gracious God, for you created all things. You formed us in your own image: male and female you created us. When we turned away from you in sin, you did not cease to care for us. but opened a path of salvation for all people. You made a covenant with Israel. and through your servants Abraham and Sarah gave the promise of a blessing to all nations. Through Moses you led your people from bondage into freedom; through the prophets you renewed your promise of salvation. Therefore, with them, and with all your saints who have served you in every age. we give you thanks and raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

A MUSIC NOTES A

"Alleluia" is part of a larger sacred work "Exsultate, Jubilate" (Rejoice, Be Glad) written by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart in 1773 while still in his teens. Mozart wrote this music specifically for the Italian opera singer, Venanzio Rauzzini, who had the leading role in Mozart's opera "Lucio Silla" which premiered in Milan, Italy in 1772. Rauzzini was known for his ability to execute extremely high and difficult passages with power. At this time women were not allowed to be in a choir or sing solos in churches. Today, this piece is usually sung by a soprano.
