# A MUSIC NOTES A

Today's anthem, 'Jesus Christ the Apple Tree,' uses the metaphor of the apple tree to represent Jesus. The text is a poem by an unknown author which first appeared in a New England hymn collection in 1784. In the first stanza, Christ is referred to as an apple tree and the Tree of Life, fitting symbols as apples were such an important staple in 18th century North America. In the fifth stanza we are told how the fruit of the Tree of Life keeps us alive and gives us the desire to be grafted onto the Tree of Life itself. Many people sing this song as a Christmas carol, although there is nothing in the words that refers to Christmas. The tune for this arrangement is 'O Waly Waly', a traditional English melody collected by Cecil Sharp and published in his 'Folk Songs from Somerset' collection in 1906.
