"Bist du bei Mir" (As Long As You Are With Me to the End) is a popular solo which has been arranged for different instruments and for voice. This beautiful melody was wrongly attributed to Johann Sebastian Bach until the 1980's. The actual composer was probably the German composer, Gottfried Heinrich Stölzel (1690-1749). Most of Stölzel's works have been lost but a fragment of an opera by him which contained this melody was discovered just a few decades ago. Bach's familiarity and respect for the work of this composer may account for his use of Stölzel's music in exercise books he created for his sons and later for his second wife, Anna Magdalena, to learn the art of copying music, a common practice before the age of publishing and copyright. This version of 'Bist du bei Mir' was set by Bach as a solo aria appropriate for his wife's voice in the 1725 'Notebook for Anna Magdalena Bach'.


