

'Bells Across the Meadows' was played at the wedding of Dave and Joan B. 52 years ago. It was written by Albert Ketèlbey (1875-1959), an English composer,

*Notes* conductor and pianist. Little is known about the creative inspiration behind the piece which was published in 1921 in two different versions, one for orchestra and another for piano (which was published in stunning colour to catch the customer's eye in sheet music shops.) An arrangement for military band would follow a few years later. Ketèlbey became famous for writing popular light music, much of which was used as accompaniments to silent films and as mood music at tea dances. He added the accent to his surname when he began to be published. 'Bells Across the Meadows' was voted the 36th most popular tune of all time in a 2003 BBC radio poll.


