Omer Westendorf (1916-1997) wrote 'You Satisfy the Hungry Heart' (VU 478), originally titled 'Gift of Finest Wheat', for a hymn writing competition in 1976 where it was chosen as the winning entry. Westendorf got his

**Notes** was chosen as the winning entry. Westendorf got his start in music publishing after WWII when he brought home some Mass settings he had discovered in Holland. This led to the creation of the World Library of Sacred Music, initially a music importing firm bringing new European music to North America. Later it began publishing its own music, including some works by Westendorf.

Sylvia G. Dunstan (1955-1993) wrote the lyrics for 'All Who Hunger' (VU 460) in 1990 and it was set to the tune 'Holy Manna' which was composed by Wm. Moore in 1825. Dunstan studied music from an early age but realized her hymn writing talents lay in creating lyrics not music. She was ordained by the Hamilton Conference of the United Church of Canada in 1980. During her career she served as a minister, prison chaplain and editor of the worship resource, Gathering
