2015 marks the 100th anniversary of the writing and publication of 'In Flanders Fields', written during the First World War by physician John McCrae, a native of Guelph. He composed the

poem while sitting in the back of an ambulance the day after McCrae performed the burial service for a close friend who had been killed in action May 2, 1915. During the service McCrae noted how poppies grew quickly around the graves of those who died at Ypres. Because of this poem, the poppy is the recognized symbol of remembrance for war dead in Canada, the countries of the British Commonwealth, and the United States. Earlier this year two statues of John McCrae were unveiled in Ottawa and in Guelph to commemorate the anniversary of the publication of this famous poem. This anthem arrangement of the poem was written by Alexander Tilley, a music educator from Nova Scotia.
