'Lo! How a Rose E'er Blooming' is a "Twelfth Night" carol from the German Rhineland region which combines the story of Luke 1-2 and Matthew 2 with Isaiah's prophecies about the "rose" from the "stem

of Jesse." In medieval iconography (the art of representation by images, pictures or engravings) the tree of Jesse was often depicted as a rose shrub. The reference to "kalten Winter" (the cold of winter) makes this one of the earliest known hymns to give a wintry setting to the Nativity story. Text and tune originated separately and are thought to be from the 15th century. They were published together for the first time in 1599 and the well known harmonization by Michael Praetorius was added in 1609. This setting of the carol remains the most widely used today.
