MUSIC Motes The Christmas Carol: There have been nativity hymns since the fourth century but they were quite solemn. At this time the performance of carols (a word derived from the Greek word 'choros' meaning circle dance with singing), was

frowned upon by the church because of its pagan connections. In the 13th century Christian teaching shifted away from a vengeful God, and the benefits of adding Christian poetry to the popular pagan carols became evident. This new form spread quickly across Europe and led to the creation of many carols still popular today, including 'In Dulci Jubilo', 'O Tannenbaum' and 'Lo! How a Rose E'er Blooming'. The Reformation put an end to the use of carols in protestant countries such as England and Scotland from the 17th to the mid-19th century. By the early 19th century the carol was all but dead, except for those preserved by collectors. However, a renewed interest in carols came about with the introduction in 1878 of the Lessons and Carols service in Truro, England. From that point the interest in this musical form has led to the huge number available to us today through collectors and their arrangements, through translation and with those newly composed.


