January 31st - World Leprosy Day

SJRUC will be observing World Leprosy Day today as part of our commitment to Mission & Outreach. You will find a flyer in the bulletin today, and we will be reading and showing a short 5 minute video about Leprosy and the efforts being put forth by "Effect: Hope", The Leprosy Mission Canada, which is a Christian development organization, focused on positive change for people living with leprosy. Please join us as we pray for those afflicted with the disease and those directly involved with efforts to help them.

MUSIC Notes Haydn's 'Pieces for Mechanical Clock' (Flötenuhr) were written in 1792 for a famous clock in Vienna. They were played automatically on a small organ operated by a clock mechanism driven by weights

and springs. Music notes were encoded onto wooden barrels or cylinders inside the organ using metal pins or staples. Each barrel typically carried several different tunes. Music was composed especially for organ clocks by such famous composers as Hayden, Beethoven, and Mozart. These instruments were usually used for entertainment in the homes of the wealthy, and were most popular during the 18th century.
