MUSIC Notes "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" (the original and more common title) was written by Robert Robinson (1735-1790) at age 22 in 1757. Robinson lived in poverty after age 5 following his

father's death but he still received an education thanks to an uncle. At age 14 he was apprenticed to a barber and hairdresser in London. Here he was exposed and converted to Methodism and he would eventually accept a call to a chapel in Cambridge. His congregation would eventually number more than 1000. Robinson was able to buy a farm where he kept cattle and sheep, grew barley and wheat, and was a corn and coal merchant when he wasn't preaching. Today we sing this hymn to the American folk tune 'Nettleton'. There is disagreement about who composed the melody, John Wyeth, a printer, or Asahel Nettleton, a roving preacher and hymn collector.
