"Morning Has Broken" was first published in 1931 with words by Eleanor Farjeon (1881-1965), an English poet and children's author. She was asked

to write a hymn that would give thanks for each day and would fit the Scottish tune "Bunessan". She would later publish the poem under its correct title, "A Morning Song - for the First Day of Spring", in her anthology of children's poetry. The tune "Bunessan" was first found in an 1888 publication as a Christmas carol, "Child in the manger, infant of Mary", translated from the Scottish Gaelic lyrics written by Mary MacDonald. The tune is named after MacDonald's birthplace on the Isle of Mull, Scotland. The song achieved international fame when it was recorded by Cat Stevens in 1971.
