John Stanley (1712-1786) was an English composer and organist. He became almost blind at age of 2 because of an accident but was still

able to begin studying music at age of 7. He was appointed to his first organist position at age 11 and became the youngest person to obtain a Bachelor of Music degree at Oxford University at age 17. In 1734 he was appointed organist to the Society of the Inner Templar where many musicians, including George Frideric Handel, regularly visited to hear him play. Though virtually blind, Stanley had a remarkable memory which helped him direct many of Handel's oratorios. If he had to accompany a newly composed oratorio, he would ask his sister-in-law to play it through just once in order to commit it to memory.
