The General Council agrees to the change, and then every presbytery (and for significant changes, each pastoral charge) gets to vote on the change. There are 5 remits we will be asked to consider and vote on. They are:

- 1. Changing to a **Three-Council** model (National, Regional, Local)
- 2. Ending the Transfer/Settlement process
- 3. Setting up a national Office of Vocation
- 4. **Funding** for the new model
- 5. Moving to One Order of Ministry
