Prayer Cycle for the United Churches in Hamilton Conference: Cayuga United Church, Erie Presbytery





'O Taste and See' was written by Ralph Vaughan Williams for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II (June 2, 1953). It was specially written for the service and was intended to be a foil for the pomp of the royal occasion. It is

a setting of Psalm 34 and was performed during the taking of communion at the ceremony. Vaughan Williams was one of the most important composers in Britain at the time. He was the musical editor for The English Hymnal (Church of England hymnal) and composed several now well-known hymns for inclusion such as 'For All the Saints' and 'Come Down, O Love Divine'. He is also known for travelling the English countryside at the turn of the century to collect folksongs and carols from singers, notating them in order to preserve them from being lost. He wrote hundreds of compositions from church music and orchestral works to music for ballet, stage and film.


