

Trombones, or as they were known historically, posaunes or sackbuts – depending where in the Western world you hailed from - were used as early as the Renaissance period to accompany choirs where they simply doubled the vocal lines.

Originally, there was an entire family of trombones – soprano, alto, tenor, bass and contra bass – but today we use up to three and primarily only two, the tenor and bass trombones. The range of the trombone to some extent does depend on the caliber of the player but generally in experienced hands can play from pedal F (2 ½ octaves below middle C) to high F on the treble staff (1 ½ octaves above middle C) for a range of four octaves. The natural vocal quality of the instrument has helped the trombone to become a strong solo instrument as well as being the 'meat' of the brass section in larger ensembles. The classic trombone quartet, three tenors and one bass trombone, has become increasingly popular in the last 30 years and many trombone choirs (up to 30 players) have established international status.

Slide by Slide trombone quartet has been making music together since 2005 and currently has one CD to their credit as well as three European tours. We hope that a new CD recording will be in the very near future. You can find us on iTunes, CD Baby and at slidebyslide.ca.


