The 'Presto' (very fast) in C major was written for Flötenuhr (musical clock) by Franz Joseph Haydn around 1788/89. It is one of a total of 32 individual works which he wrote for a variety of mechanical musical instruments. These instruments were

extremely popular amongst the very wealthy during the late 18th century. Haydn was a prolific Austrian composer who has earned such acclamations and credits as "Father of the Symphony" and "Father of the String Quartet". He was also a friend and mentor of Mozart and a teacher of Beethoven.
