During next Sunday's service we will be remembering the loved ones we've lost in the past year; as well as celebrating communion together.

Blest Are the Pure of Heart' was written by Richard MUSIC S. Eaton (1914-1968). Born in Victoria, British Notes Columbia, Eaton showed an aptitude for music at an early age. He began piano lessons and became a soloist with the boys' choir at Christ Church Cathedral. A new organist at the cathedral recognized his potential and began giving him organ lessons at the age of 15. By 16 Richard was the assistant organist and conductor of the boys' choir. He had dropped out of school after Gr. 8 but decided to complete his high school diploma as an adult in order to study organ and composition at McGill University. After holding very successful teaching positions at Upper Canada College and Ottawa Technical School he joined the faculty at the University of Alberta in Edmonton, where he remained for the rest of his career. Throughout his life Eaton was a prolific composer. 'Blest Are the Pure of Heart' was his first published composition and it has been performed widely throughout Canada. It was first performed in 1947 and dedicated to the choir of Montreal's Knox Crescent Presbyterian Church where his future father-in-law was organist.


