

MUSIC

Healey Willan, who wrote today's offertory, was born in England in 1880 and emigrated to Canada in 1913 to become head of the theory department at the Toronto Conservatory of Music. Known for

his sense of humour he was once quoted as saying that he was "English by birth, Irish by extraction, Canadian by adoption and Scotch by absorption". More importantly we can claim him as one of our most important and influential composers. He was an organist, teacher and composer of over 800 compositions but is best known for his sacred choral and organ works. In 1953 he was the first ever non-Briton commissioned to write an anthem for a coronation, in this case for Queen Elizabeth II. In 1967 he was named a Companion of the Order of Canada. Willan was also one of the first Canadian musicians to appear on a Canadian postage stamp.
