

MUSIC Motes

Henri Gagnon (1887-1961) organist, teacher and composer, was born in Quebec City. He studied piano with his father and began performing publicly at an early age. His real success began in 1901 with

a concert he gave at the Pan-American Exposition in Buffalo, N.Y. at the age of 14. In 1907 he moved to Paris, France to continue his organ and composition studies and while there gave many concerts. He returned to Canada in 1910, preferring the life of a church musician to that of a virtuoso. He was appointed assistant organist at the Notre Dame Basilica-Cathedral in Quebec City, and in 1915 was appointed full time organist. He remained at the Cathedral for 51 years. He began teaching piano and organ at Laval University in 1923. His compositions were mainly for piano and organ but he also wrote some choral works and vocal pieces. The Elegie was written in 1901 when he was 14.
