MUSIC The anthem, "Jesus Walked This Lonesome Valley", portrays the image of Jesus facing trials in a lonesome place and sets the scene for the trials yet to come during Holy Week. The actual source of

this hymn tune is unknown. There is lack of agreement as to whether it is an African American spiritual or an American folk tune and as such, there are several variants of both the text and the melody. The final verse of the hymn talks of us "walking by ourselves". James Cone (*The Spirituals and the Blues: An Interpretation, 1972*) argues that "the journey of salvation is like a lonesome valley with hard trials, and the believer has to travel the valley for himself." The final phrase of our anthem superimposes Christ's journey with our journey.
