Welford Russell (1900-1975) was a Canadian MUSIC composer who is remembered in particular for his lotes choral works. Born in Neepawa, Manitoba, he was a surgeon by profession, and served as a medical missionary in India from 1925-1941. He pursued music in his spare time, studying organ in Ireland and music composition and singing at the Toronto (now Royal) Conservatory of Music. He has a number of published works and 'Who Is At My Window, Who?' is arguably the most performed today. The poem used as the text is from a collection of Reformation poetry entitled 'Gude and Godlie Ballates' published in Edinburgh in 1578. The original poem, secular and portraying a lover speaking from within the house, appears to have influenced the placing of Christ within the house. He is in conversation with the sinner who is outside looking in. Christ invites the sinner to enter, a twist on the usual symbol where Christ is the stranger knocking on the door.
