

Dr. John W. Vandertuin began his formal study in MUSIC music after moving from Brandon, Manitoba to attend lotes the Ontario School for the Blind in Brantford. Ontario. He gave his first recital in Paris, France at age 14 while studying there. He later studied at the University of Western Ontario, the University of Michigan and the Sweelinck Conservatory in Amsterdam, and was twice invited to compete in the International Improvisation Competition in Haarlem, the Netherlands, the second Canadian to be so honoured. In addition to his international performance and competitions, Dr. Vandertuin has composed many works for organ and choir. Variations on "Aurelia" (The Church's One Foundation) was commissioned in 2007 to honour Douglas Haas' 40 years as Music Director of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Kitchener.
