

Coming to the Table

- One: The Lord be with you.
- All: And also with you.
- One: Lift up your hearts.
- All: We lift them up to the Lord.
- One: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Youth: Why do we give thanks and praise at this table?

One: We give thanks because God is always with us.

Giving our Thanks to God

One: We thank you, God, Creator of us all; from the beginning you made the world and all its creatures. You made people to live for you and for one another. We praise you, O God.

All: We praise you, O God.

One: You created Adam and Eve and gave them a garden; you showed Noah a rainbow; you gave Moses strength to free your people and taught Miriam to sing; you gave courage to Esther and loyalty to Ruth; you gave David a harp to sing your praise, and helped him defeat the giant. We praise you, O God.

- All: We praise you, O God.
- One: Yet, even they turned away from you and forgot about you, as we do too. But you did not forget. You sent Jesus to the world to show how much you love us and to bring us back to you again. We praise you, O God.

#### All: We praise you, O God.

One: He came as one of us, first an infant, then a child, later a youth, then an adult. He rejoiced with those who rejoiced, and wept with those who wept. To the despairing, he spoke a word of hope. To the sick, he gave healing. To the hurting, he was a friend. Still, people turned away from you. They betrayed Jesus and nailed him to a cross. But he was lifted from the grave and restored to life, that he might be with us and we with him, alive for evermore! Therefore with all the saints of every time and place, we join the angels in their praise:

Holy, Holy, Holy

All: Holy Holy Holy are you, God of power and might; Heaven and earth are filled with your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in your name. Hosanna in the highest, hosanna in the highest!

Remembering Jesus

Youth: Why do we eat bread at this table?

One: We gather at this table to remember that on the night before he died, Jesus ate with his friends, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it, he broke it and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Each time you do this, remember me."

Youth: Why do we drink from the cup at this table?

One: That same night, Jesus also took a cup, and after giving thanks, passed it to his friends, saying: "Drink. This cup, poured out for you, is the promise of God. Whenever you drink it, remember me." Youth: What do we remember at this table?

One: We remember Jesus' death and celebrate his resurrection; we await with hope his coming again to bring peace and justice to the earth; and we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come, come again.

Youth: Why do we pray at this table?

One: We pray for God's world and all those we would share this meal with...

Prayers for our Community and the Lord's Prayer

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory. For ever and ever. Amen.

One: Send, O God,

your Holy Spirit upon us and what we do here, that we and these gifts, touched by your Spirit, may be signs of life and love to one another, and to the world. Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

all glory is yours, God most holy, now and forever.

"When It Was Yet Dark" takes us into the thoughts and feelings of Mary Magdalene as she approaches the tomb of Christ on the morning of the first Easter. Composer Stephen Hatfield has paraphrased John's story (John 20:1, 11-18) and treats the Resurrection as a human drama, full of human doubts, fears and pain. He then set these words to a beautiful old hymn tune, Pleading Saviour, from an

1855 collection. Stephen Hatfield lives on Vancouver Island. In addition to his choral works, he enjoys composing for the theatre. While teaching in Ontario he became recognized as a leader in multiculturalism and musical folklore, an interest that shows itself in many of his compositions and arrangements. Hatfield has received awards for his work in education, music and poetry,




#### Join the SJR Lawnmower Racing Team!
