Prayer Cycle for the United Churches in Hamilton Conference: Faith Centennial United Church, Selkirk

Music Notes "Words of Chief Seattle" is an original composition by Canadian Amy Stephen using a text attributed to Chief Seattle (1786? -1866). A chief of both the Suquamish and Duwanish tribes on the U.S. west coast, he was a respected leader and orator.

Seattle had a desire for two very different cultures (American and native) to co-exist in peace and constantly pursued a path of accommodation between settlers and his people. Very early on, a white settlement was named in his honour and has grown to become the city of Seattle, Washington. Despite misgivings about signing away so much land in a treaty he understood that his people were greatly outnumbered. He had the opportunity to speak at a gathering in the presence of the state's Governor. His actual words have been lost due to translation and rewriting but the sentiment of his speech has become a famous symbol of environmental responsibility and respect of the land rights of his people.
