- One: Easter is not an event that has occurred but an adventure that has begun not a place that we have visited but a path on which we stand. This is not a story which is complete, but that which is still unfolding, with characters still breathing stations still teeming with the promise of new life not just for you and me but for all people, in all places. A cosmic crux, a turning point of time.
- Two: Easter is the season of wild hope, of dangerous intent, of potent promise where the future flaps unfurled in the spirit's breeze. Easter is the season where hopes bubble with uncorked effervescence, where toes tap to free-form rhythms where rainbow hues splash empty canvas.

One: Today we continue the journey. We re-enter the story to explore our questions, to uncover our doubts, and to face our nagging need.

- Two: We walk the path of two who traveled a dusty road wrapped in confusion and despair. We walk with two who shared the company of a stranger, voicing their pain, airing their fears, who heard words of hope and promise and who shared the true bread of life.
- One: Today we re-enter the story with expectation that Christ will reveal himself to us, in sights and sounds in words and symbols, in bread and wine.

#### All: Come, O Jesus, come.

Today's anthem, Stay With Us, has several local connections. Bev Foster is a performer, songwriter and music educator from the Toronto area. She is also Executive Director of the Room 217 Foundation, a not-for-profit corporation dedicated to see music become an integral part of person-centred care, providing music resources, programs and education to health care providers. Susan Brown is music leader, pianist and organist at Duff's Presbyterian Church near Aberfoyle, Ont. She is also a coordinator at Beckett School of Music, part of Wilfrid Laurier University. This anthem was published by Kelman Hall Publishing which was started in 1998 by local musicians Bill Labron, Lynn McRuer and Peter Nikiforuk. Their goal was to publish affordable, good quality choral music written by Canadian composers. It expanded that mandate when composers from outside of Canada submitted compositions to the company.
