

Prayer Cycle for the United Churches in Hamilton Conference: **St. Andrew's United Church, Brantford**

Music Notes Boris Berlin (1907-2001) was born in Russia, moved to Canada in 1928 to begin teaching at the Toronto Conservatory of Music and became a naturalized Canadian in 1931. He was disturbed by the lack of

Canadian material available to music students because the Conservatory system focussed mainly on European composers. During his career he wrote over 20 pedagogical works and more than 200 compositions. Over 4 million copies of his work have been sold. In 2000 he was made an Officer of the Order of Canada and the citation reads "Known as the teacher of teachers he profoundly influenced musical instruction in our country. Having taught some of Canada's most illustrious musicians he is known for his extensive contribution to pedagogical materials and for his piano pieces for young performers."
