Prayer Cycle for the United Churches in Hamilton Conference: *St. Davids-Queenston United Church* 

'Song for Peace' was written by Canadian songwriter, guitarist, record producer, folklorist and author, Allister MacGillivray, and it was arranged for USIC lotes choir by Diane Loomer. MacGillivray was born in Glace Bay, Nova Scotia to a musical family and he began performing at age 7. After graduation he toured for 2 years with a trio which opened for well known performers such as Anne Murray and the Irish Rovers, and they "brought down the house" at the Grand Ole Opry. In the 1970's he recorded several albums with the trio Ryan's Fancy, which featured some of his music. Around 1980 he settled in rural Cape Breton to concentrate on a career of songwriting, composing and documenting the Cape Breton experience. Diane Loomer (1940-2012) is internationally recognized as one of Canada's leading musicians. She was the director and founder of Chor Leoni Men's Choir and co-founder of the Elektra Women's Choir. She composed and arranged numerous spirituals and folk songs for the 2 choirs and her compositions have been published and recorded internationally. She was recipient of numerous awards and honours including Order of Canada (1999) and the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal (2012).

**SJR Boiler Replacement!** Over the next couple of weeks, thanks to the diligence of the Property Committee and chair Dave B., SJR will be replacing the boiler of the church. After months of research, we have chosen Viessmann Vitodens boilers installed by Conestogo Mechanical, with the complete installation cost to just over \$51000. This will change our rating from 60-70% efficient to 90-95% efficiency. Because of the generosity of many people over the years, our Capital Fund is able to pay for this purchase outright. This reduces the Capital Fund to around \$64000. Thank you to all those who continue to support the ongoing ministry of our church, and we look forward to toasty warm Sundays in the winter!!
