Prayer Cycle for the United Churches in Hamilton Conference: Caistorville United Church, Merritts United Church Sinclairville United Church, Erie Presbytery

VU 421, Lead On, O Cloud of Presence, is set to the tune Lancashire which was composed in 1835 usic by Henry Thomas Smart for use at a mission festival Notes at Blackburn, Lancashire, England. Smart was a 19th Century English organist and composer. It was originally set to the text "From Greenland's Icy Mountains" but in 1905 was included in the Methodist Hymnal with the words "Lead On, O King Eternal" by Ernest W. Shurtleff. In 1974 it was set to Ruth Duck's text which we are singing today. "Lead On, O Cloud of Presence" was written in response to the liberation movement and includes reference to the exodus of the Israelites from Eqypt. Duck is a Professor of Worship at a theological seminary in Illinois and her primary research interests include baptism, liturgical healing, liturgy and culture, and feminist study of liturgy.
