There is some discrepancy over the origins of O Waly Waly (The Water is Wide). Part of the text for the original ballad dates back to 17th century Scotland but the first published version in 1724 was attributed to an

Englishman. The tune we know today (see VU 372), was compiled from parts of 3 different field recordings made in Somerset, England between 1904 and 1906. There are also many variants in text, including the one made popular in the 1950's by Pete Seeger, The Water is Wide. Hal Hopson adapted and arranged O Waly Waly as an anthem in 1971 with words from 1 Corinthians 13 and his version became known as 'The Gift of Love'.
