MV 171 Christ Has No Body Now But Yours uses an adapted text attributed to St. Teresa of Avila with music by Rick Gunn. Gunn began working as a minister for children, youth and young adults at Bedford United Church, Dartmouth, Nova Scotia 15

years ago, and over time the position has transitioned to Minister of Music and Youth. He has two solo albums to his credit and performs in a local jazz group. St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582) was a prominent Spanish mystic, Carmelite nun, reformer, author and theologian. Her books form an integral part of Spanish Renaissance literature as well as Christian mysticism and meditation practices. Upset by the lax practices within the Carmelite Monastery where she was living, she founded a reformed Carmelite convent based on a commitment to the values of poverty and simplicity. For the remainder of her life she travelled throughout Spain setting up new monasteries based along the ancient monastic traditions. But her efforts weren't without opposition as many resented her reforms and the implied criticism of existing religious orders. Today she is considered to be one of the great Christian mystics.
