



Moses Hogan (1957-2003) is considered to have been single-handedly responsible for the introduction of the professional choral spiritual and for the revitalization of the African-American spiritual

tradition. A very talented pianist, he enjoyed a brief career as a solo performer, but in 1980, became concerned about the decreasing popularity of traditional spirituals. It became his passion to revive choral singing of this medium by composing new arrangements of classic spirituals and he formed several choirs to perform this music internationally. He has over 70 published compositions and his most famous publication is The Oxford Book of Spirituals (2002), a comprehensive compilation of arrangements of African-American music for choir.
