J. S. Bach was court composer and organist in the court of the Duke of Weimar, Germany, from 1708 to 1717. During that time, his employer's son, Prince Johann Ernst, went to Amsterdam to study. An enthusiastic violinist, the Prince attended concerts

and returned home with many pieces of music purchased from publishing houses in the city. He was particularly a fan of concertos by such composers an Antonio Vivaldi and commissioned Bach to transcribe (re-write) these pieces into organ compositions, a popular concert style in Amsterdam. Bach used the re-writing process to learn about this style of music and apply techniques to his own compositions. This concerto was originally written for 2 violins and a cello. Antonio Vivaldi, a contemporary of Bach, was an Italian composer of wrote hundreds of compositions for students at an orphanage where he taught music.
