

IN OUR CHURCH:

COVID19 Prevention at SJR: Illnesses associated with the new coronavirus are similar to several respiratory illnesses and include fever, dry cough, sore throat and headache. Most cases are mild to moderate with a subset experiencing more severe illness with shortness of breath and difficulty breathing. Reported signs and symptoms include: fever, coughing, difficulty breathing, pneumonia in both lungs. *Prevention:* Thoroughly wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Refrain from shaking hands. Cover your cough with a tissue then toss tissue in trash. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, mouth. Please do not attend church if you are unwell. If you have visited any of the high-risk countries (currently mainland China, Hong Kong, Iran, Italy, Japan, Singapore, South Korea) please do not attend church for at least 2 weeks after your return.

Food Drive *now until March 29th* SJRUC is hosting its initial food drive for 2020 in support of the Region of Waterloo Food Bank. Collection stations will be set up in the usual locations in the church. Our three food drives, which took place in 2019, collected close to 1,000 pounds of food items, and it is hoped our efforts in 2020 will at least match the generosity exhibited last year.
