

In lighting this candle candles, we thank God for giving us: Hope and Peace.

The resurrected Christ offers us peace. In times of trouble, we can count on that peace deep within our hearts and we can share it with all those around us. We take this moment to think of those who are working hard to battle the pandemic. May they feel your deepest peace!

Light two purple candles – Hope and Peace

Opening Prayer adapted from a prayer by Loren Richmond
