Readings from the Scriptures (CEB) Mark 10:2-16

² Some Pharisees came and, trying to test him, they asked. "Does the Law allow a man to divorce his wife?" ³ Jesus answered, "What did Moses command you?" ⁴They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a divorce certificate and to divorce his wife." 5 Jesus said to them, "He wrote this commandment for you because of your unvielding hearts. ⁶ At the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. ⁷ Because of this, a man should leave his father and mother and be joined together with his wife, 8 and the two will be one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. 9 Therefore, humans must not pull apart what God has put together." 10 Inside the house, the disciples asked him again about this. 11 He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; ¹² and if a wife divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery." ¹³ People were bringing children to Jesus so that he would bless them. But the disciples scolded them. 14 When Jesus saw this, he grew angry and said to them, "Allow the children to come to me. Don't forbid them, because God's kingdom belongs to people like these children. 15 I assure you that whoever doesn't welcome God's kingdom like a child will never enter it." 16 Then he hugged the children and blessed them.
