#### **OUR CHRISTMAS MESSAGE**

**Building our Story** 

One: We come today to "build our nativity"; to share in our story. Although this story takes thousands of year ago, the truth of this birth bringing Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love is born fresh in us each Christmas. The tradition of sharing the story in the fashion of a Christmas Putz, is an old European tradition. Related to the old medieval mystery plays, the putz may have originated to help children better appreciate the Christmas story. The word "putz" is German "putzen" for "to decorate, the especially to adorn a church." The practice was to assign each family, in the village, a character from the nativity story. Then in great secret, they would make their creation; not knowing how large or small, or out of what material, anyone else's character would be. Then, on Christmas Eve, all the families of the village would gather in the town square, sing the songs of Christmas, and tell the story. As it was being read, when your family's character was mentioned, you would bring it forward and place it in having the creche. Todav. we are Celebration, by building our own nativity scene. For those who have made members of our scene, when it comes your turn, please put up your hand - and I'll come and collect it! But first...the story:

Scripture – Luke 2:1-7

In those days Caesar Augustus declared that everyone throughout the empire should be enrolled in the tax lists. <sup>2</sup> This first enrollment occurred when Quirinius governed Syria. <sup>3</sup> Everyone went to their

own cities to be enrolled. <sup>4</sup> Since Joseph belonged to David's house and family line, he went up from the city of Nazareth in Galilee to David's city, called Bethlehem, in Judea. <sup>5</sup> He went to be enrolled together with Mary, who was promised to him in marriage and who was pregnant. <sup>6</sup> While they were there, the time came for Mary to have her baby. <sup>7</sup> She gave birth to her firstborn child, a son, wrapped him snugly, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the questroom.

Coming to the Manger (Donkey, Mary, Joseph, Jesus)

Carol Away in a Manger (Pentatonix)

- 1 Away in a manger, no crib for his bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head. The stars in the sky looked down where he lay, the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.
- 2 The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes, but little Lord Jesus, no crying he makes. I love thee, Lord Jesus; look down from the sky, and stay by my side 'til morning is nigh.
  - 3 Be near me, Lord Jesus, I ask thee to stay close by me for ever, and love me, I pray. Bless all the dear children in thy tender care, and take us to heaven, to live with thee there.

Scripture – Luke 2:8-20

<sup>8</sup> Nearby shepherds were living in the fields, guarding their sheep at night. <sup>9</sup> The Lord's angel stood before them, the Lord's glory shone around

them, and they were terrified. <sup>10</sup> The angel said, "Don't be afraid! Look! I bring good news to you wonderful, joyous news for all people. 11 Your savior is born today in David's city. He is Christ the Lord. 12 This is a sign for you: you will find newborn baby wrapped snugly and lying in manger." 13 Suddenly a great assembly of the heavenly forces was with the angel praising God. They said, 14 "Glory to God in heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors." 15 When the angels returned to heaven, the shepherds said to each other, "Let's go right now to Bethlehem and see what's happened. Let's confirm what the Lord has revealed to us." 16 They went quickly and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. 17 When they saw this, they reported what they had been told about this child. 18 Everyone who heard it was amazed at what the shepherds told them. <sup>19</sup> Mary committed these things to memory and considered them carefully. 20 The shepherds returned home, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen. Everything happened just as they had been told.

Scripture – Matthew 2:1-2, 7-12

(Some time later) After Jesus was Bethlehem in the territory of Judea during the rule of King Herod, magi came from the Jerusalem. <sup>2</sup> They asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We've seen his star in the east, and we've come to honor him." <sup>7</sup>Then Herod secretly called for the magi and found out from them the time when the star had first appeared. 8 He sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search carefully for the child. When you've found him, report to me so that I too may go and honor him." 9 When they heard the king, they went; and look, the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stood over the place where the child was. 10 When they saw the star, they were filled with joy. 11 They entered the house and saw the child with Mary his mother. Falling to their knees, they honored him. Then they opened their treasure chests and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. 12 Because they were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another route.
