Scripture Reading (The Message) Jeremiah 29:1-14

¹This is the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to what was left of the elders among the exiles, to the priests and prophets and all the exiles whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken to Babylon from Jerusalem, including King Jehoiachin, the queen mother, the government leaders, and all the skilled laborers and craftsmen. ³ The letter was carried by Elasah son of Shaphan and Gemariah son of Hilkiah, whom Zedekiah king of Judah had sent to Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon. The letter said: 4 This is the Message from God-of-the-Angel-Armies, Israel's God, to all the exiles I've taken from Jerusalem to Babylon: 5 "Build houses and make yourselves at home. "Put in gardens and eat what grows in that country. 6 "Marry and have children. Encourage your children to marry and have children so that you'll thrive in that country and not waste away. ⁷ "Make vourselves at home there and work for the country's welfare. "Pray for Babylon's well-being. If things go well for Babylon, things will go well for you." 8-9 Yes. Believe it or not, this is the Message from God-ofthe-Angel-Armies, Israel's God: "Don't let all those so-called preachers and know-it-alls who are all over the place there take you in with their lies. Don't pay any attention to the fantasies they keep coming up with to please you. They're a bunch of liars preaching lies—and claiming I sent them! I never sent them, believe me." God's Decree! 10-11 This is God's Word on the subject: "As soon as Babylon's seventy years are up and not a day before, I'll show up and take care of you as I promised and bring you back home. I know what I'm doing. I have it all planned out—plans to take care of you, not abandon you, plans to give you the future you hope for. 12 "When you call on me, when you come and pray to me, I'll listen. 13-14 "When you come looking for me, you'll find me. "Yes, when you get serious about finding me and want it more than anything else, I'll make sure you won't be disappointed." God's Decree. "I'll turn things around for you. I'll bring you back from all the countries into which I drove you"— God's Decree—"bring you home to the place from which I sent you off into exile You can count on it

minimum of 50 yards of a coloured, Easter themed yarn to complete one of our items. Also, if you are able to assist with this crocheted project we are in need of volunteers. Please contact the church office if you are interested. We can arrange pickup up or drop off yarn.

From the Kenya Education Committee SJRUC provided \$9,605.00 in financial support in 2021 which allowed 31 students who live in abject poverty (e.g. no clean water, electricity, or regular meals) in the Ugunja area of Kenya to receive an education that could help them break the cycle of poverty. We are always looking for new sponsors as there is a long waiting list of potential sponsorship students. However, we urgently need to find new sponsors for two NYATI students whose sponsors passed away in 2021. Josephine Akinyi is a second-year student in the three-year Library Information Sciences diploma program, while Dan Ochieng Oluoch is in his third year of the four-year Bachelor of Sciences Program in Information Security and Forensic Studies. The annual costs to sponsor a particular student are:

- Nyasanda Community High School \$350
- Nyasanda Technical Institute (NYATI) \$500 or \$600 depending on program & year)
- University \$500

You can also choose to provide a smaller amount of money that would be pooled together with other smaller contributions to fund an eligible student. Your donations cover the costs of things like uniforms, shoes, lunch, books, academic tours, and motivational speakers. Tax Receipts are provided. Sponsors receive information about the progress of their sponsored student throughout the year. Most sponsors also achieve a short note, letter or Christmas card from their grateful student.

The 2022 high school year begins in April and we would need your financial contributions by the end of February as it takes a while to get the money to the appropriate educational institutions. If you are interested in supporting Josephine, Dan - or any other student - please contact the church office.
