

Waterloo Regional Food Bank Beginning February 27th, and ending Thursday, March 24th, we will undergo our first of three fundraisers for the Waterloo Regional Food Bank. Boxes will be set up at the usual locations within the church to collect food items. Financial donations will be greatly appreciated during this time span. Make sure all financial donations are in envelopes indicating donor identification & donation destination. Any cheques should be made out to SJRUC with the purpose indicated. A final collection of all items will take place in the church parking lot on Thursday, March 24th from 6:00PM to 7:30PM.

Executive Update On March 1st the Executive of SJR met to discuss further reopening plans, especially in light of Ontario's further lifting of vaccination passports, etc. After a lengthy discussion, we decided to keep status quo for the month of March. Masks, distancing, and vaccination status will still be required for worship during this time as we monitor cases and learn from the community around us as they take steps to embrace a new normal. Our hopes will be that by April we are able to increase numbers to 75% capacity, and potentially eliminate vaccine requirements. In the months that follow we hope to embrace 100% capacity, Gather in Gab in person, and all the other activities we so miss. Until then...
