**Executive Update** On March 1<sup>st</sup> the Executive of SJR met to discuss further reopening plans, especially in light of Ontario's further lifting of vaccination passports, etc. After a lengthy discussion, we decided to <u>keep status quo for the month of March</u>. Masks, distancing, and vaccination status will still be required for worship during this time as we monitor cases and learn from the community around us as they take steps to embrace a new normal. Our hopes will be that by April we are able to increase numbers to 75% capacity, and potentially eliminate vaccine requirements. In the months that follow we hope to embrace 100% capacity, Gather in Gab in person, and all the other activities we so miss.
