Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). 17 Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." 18 Mary Magdalene went and announced to the

disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

Executive Update As a result of our meeting on April 5, we are taking tentative steps forward to resuming life together and worship as we would like. At this time, we are increasing attendance numbers to allow more people to enjoy Easter together, moving from limits of 55-60 to 75-80. During this time, masks, distancing, and vaccination status will still be required for worship. We had hoped to lift more restrictions however the current case load in our community is proving that a little more time is necessary. In the months to come, we still hope to reach 100% capacity, Gather in Gab in person, and all the other activities we so miss.

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
