Fall Food Drive: Due to high inflation the Waterloo Regional Food Bank is straining to meet the basic nutritional needs of a growing number of families within our region. During our initial food drive earlier in 2022 we were able to deliver cheques totaling \$1,055, and 200 lb of food to the Food Bank. Our 2nd food drive of 2022 for the Food Bank is planned to take place from *Sunday, September 18th to Thursday, October 13th.* Beginning September 18th boxes will be set up within the church at the usual locations to collect food items, and a pickup truck will be parked in the church parking lot on Thursday, October 13th from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. to collect additional food items. In this six-week study, we will dig into the lives of biblical heroes who were messy people just like us but who were used by God in powerful ways. Facts about Bees:

- Bees have 5 eyes, 2 pairs of wings, and 6 legs
- Male bees in the hive are called drones, female bees in the hive (except the queen) are called worker bees
- Bees fly about 20 mph and their wings beat 200 times per second or 12,000 beats per minute.
- The queen by can lay up to 2,000 eggs per day.
- · Losing its stinger will cause a bee to die
- The lifespan of a bee during the working season is about 6 weeks
- Bees carry pollen on their hind legs in a pollen basket or corbicula
- An average beehive can hold around 50,000 bees
- Forager bees must collect nectar from about 2 million flowers to make 1 pound of honey
- The average forager makes about 1/12th of a teaspoon of honey in their lifetime
- The principal form of communication among honey bees is through chemicals called pheromones
- Bees are important because they pollinate approximately 130 agricultural crops including fruit, fiber, nut, and vegetable crops.
 Bees help to produce not only more but also larger fruit and vegetables.
- It takes one colony of honeybees to pollinate an acre of fruit trees.
- Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba are Canada's largest honey producers.
- Honeybees are responsible for pollinating one-third of Canada's food crops.
- In Canada, the value of bees pollinating fruit, vegetables and legumes is over \$1 billion per year: that's ten times the value of honey produced.
- Honey colour and flavour depend on the flower source.
