<sup>46</sup> Mary said, "With all my heart I glorify the Lord! <sup>47</sup> In the depths of who I am I rejoice in God my savior. <sup>48</sup> God has looked with favor on the low status of his servant. Look! From now on, everyone will consider me highly favored <sup>49</sup> because the mighty one has done great things for me. Holy is God's name. <sup>50</sup> God shows mercy to

everyone, from one generation to the next, who honors him as God. <sup>51</sup> God has shown strength with his arm.
